FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT DECEMBER 1, 2024

The spirit of the Advent liturgy, commemorating the age-long expectation of the Redeemer, will prepare us to celebrate the mystery of the Word made Flesh by arousing in each one of us an intimate, personal expectation of the renewed coming of Christ to our soul. This coming is accomplished by grace; to the degree in which grace develops and matures in us, it becomes more copious, more penetrating, until it transforms the soul into an alter Christus.

To Thee have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. *Psalm.* Show me, O Lord, Thy ways: and teach me Thy paths. \tilde{V} . What are Vespers and Why Should I Go to Them?

Vespers make up the seventh of the eight "hours" of the Divine Office. They find their ritual origins in the Jewish temple evening sacrifice which involved the use of incense, candles and the singing of psalms. The prayers of the Divine Office serve as a secondary channel through which the graces of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass are applied to the Church making them the most efficacious form of prayer after the Mass. This spiritual lifeline for the Church is so important that the priests and religious of the Church are bound under pain of sin to pray the entire office every day.

Although most people in today's culture associate the time they take off from work on Sunday with physical rest, the principal reason for resting from labor on Sundays and Holy Days is to offer fitting sacrifice to God by attending the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. It is quite fitting, then, to include the attendance of Vespers in one's observance of the Lord's Day. In fact, in the Middle Ages, the attendance of Sunday vespers was part of the Sunday obligation. Thus, St. John Vianney, the model of parish priests, encouraged his parishioners to attend the Divine Office in the parish church at Ars. Similarly, we would like to encourage you to keep the Lord's Day holy by participating in Sunday Vespers at 2 p.m. every Sunday at St. Joseph. The soothing chants and beautiful texts of the Sunday vespers liturgy both physically and spiritually give a fitting repose to the Lord's Day. So just like St. John Vianney we warmly encourage you tap into the Church's rich traditions and sanctify the Lord's Day by attending both Holy Mass and sung vespers which we pray at 2 p.m. every Sunday.
