

SUNDAY IN THE OCTAVE OF CHRISTMAS DECEMBER 29, 2024

Today's Mass is an echo of Christmas, but while it speaks of peace and joy, it also has a note of deep sadness. The Gospel (Luke 2:33-40) suddenly transports us to the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, forty days after His birth, and repeats Simeon's prophecy, "Behold this Child is set for the fall and for the resurrection of many in Israel and for a sign which shall be contradicted." The prophecy of Simeon was addressed directly to the Virgin Mother. "And thy own soul a sword shall pierce." The bloody vision of the Cross is thus mingled unexpectedly with the charming scene of the Nativity, reminding us that the tender Babe of Bethlehem is the divine Lamb who will one day be immolated for the salvation of the world.

INTROIT Wisdom 18:14-15

While all things were in quiet silence and the night was in the midst of her course, Thy almighty Word, O Lord, leaped down from heaven from Thy royal throne. Psalm. The Lord hath reigned, He is clothed with beauty: the Lord is clothed with strength, and hath girded Himself. \vec{V} . Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — While all . . .

O Almighty and everlasting God, direct our actions according to Thy good pleasure; that in the Name of Thy beloved Son we may deserve to abound in good works: Who livest and reignest . . .

EPISTLE Galatians 4:1-7

Brethren, as long as the heir is a child, he differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all: but is under tutors and governors until the time appointed by the father: so we also, when we were children, were serving under the elements of the world. But when the fullness of the time was come, God sent His Son, made of a woman, made under the law, that He might redeem them who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. And because you are sons, God hath sent the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying: Abba, Father. Therefore now he is not a servant, but a son: and if a son, an heir also through God.

GOSPEL *Luke* 2:33-40

At that time Joseph and Mary the Mother of Jesus were wondering at those things which were spoken concerning Him. And Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary His mother: Behold, this child is set for the fall, and for the resurrection of many in Israel: and for a sign which shall be contradicted: and thine own soul a sword shall pierce,

that out of many hearts thoughts may be revealed. And there was one Anna a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Aser: she was far advanced in years, and had liveth with her husband seven years from her virginity. And she was a widow until fourscore and four years: who departed not from the temple, by fastings and prayers serving night and day. Now she, at the same hour, coming in, confessed to the Lord: and spoke of Him to all that looked for the redemption of Israel. And after they had performed all things according to the law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee to their city, Nazareth. And the Child grew and waxed strong, full of wisdom: and the grace of God was in Him.—Creed

January 3 is First Friday. Masses will be offered at 8:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. As always, the Friday Holy Hour will begin at 5:30 p.m. and will be followed by Benediction.

JANUARY 4—FIRST SATURDAY

First Saturday is this Saturday, January 4. Masses will be offered at 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Adoration and Benediction will take place from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.
