SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT March 16, 2025

What has been disfigured by sin cannot regain its original supernatural beauty except by way of purifying suffering. God does not console us for our entertainment but rather for our encouragement, for our strengthening, for the increase of our generosity in suffering for love of Him.
