QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY March 2, 2025

To those who dream only of prosperity and earthly glory, the language of the Cross is incomprehensible. Those who have a purely material ideal of life find it very difficult to understand any spiritual significance, and especially that of suffering. To human wisdom, suffering is incomprehensible; it is disconcerting; it can lead one to murmur against divine Providence and even to lose all trust in God. However, according to the wisdom of God, suffering is a means of salvation and redemption.

INTROIT Psalm 30:3, 4

Be Thou unto me a God, a Protector, and a house of refuge, to save me: for Thou art my strength and my refuge: and for Thy Name's sake Thou wilt lead me, and nourish me. Psalm. In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and save me. \tilde{V} . Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.—Be thou . . .

EPISTLE I Corinthians 13:1–13

Brethren: If I speak with the tongues of men and of Angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal. And if I should have prophecy, and should know all mysteries and all know-ledge, and if I should have all faith so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing. And if I should distribute all my goods to feed the poor, and if I should deliver my body to be burned, and have not charity, it profits me nothing. Charity is patient, is kind: charity envies not, deals not perversely, is not puffed up, is not ambitious, seeks not her own, is not provoked to anger, thinketh no evil, rejoices not in iniquity, but rejoices with the truth: bears all things, believeth all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Charity never falls away: whether prophecies shall be made void, or tongues shall cease, or knowledge shall be destroyed. For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect is come, that which is in part shall be done away. When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child. But when I became a man, I put away the things of a child. We see now through a glass in a dark manner: but then face to face. Now I know in part: but then I shall know even as I am known. And now there remain faith, hope, and charity, these three: but the greatest of these is charity.

And immediately he saw and followed Him, glorifying God. And all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.— Creed.

THE LAWS OF FAST & ABSTINENCE

Father Kasak

The current practice of fast and abstinence falls under the code of Canon Law. The law of abstinence begins on one's fourteenth birthday and is not lifted due to older age. The days of abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. The law obliges abstention from flesh meat. Days of penance apply to all the Faithful and include the season of Lent and Fridays outside of Lent. The practice for the laws of Fasting applies to everyone aged 18-59, inclusive. One full meal is permitted and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal. The days of fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The obligation to do penance is lifted on Fridays which are also celebrated as a solemnity.

ST. JOSEPH'S ALTAR

We will have a St. Joseph's Altar on Wednesday, March 19, in the hall beneath the Church. You can bring bread, pasta, or fish. Bread can be from the store or homemade into symbolic shapes:

The Latin Cross: The ultimate symbol of our Lord's suffering and salvation.

The Bambino: The baby Jesus to whom St. Joseph was foster father.

St. Joseph's Staff: Legend has it that St. Joseph's staff blossomed into a lily, a symbol both of life and death.

St. Joseph's Purse: This symbol is a reminder to give alms to the poor during Lent.

A Sheaf of Wheat: Wheat is a reminder that, when a single, tiny grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it bears much more food at harvest time — and that the early spring harvest of greens is almost here.

St. Joseph himself: St. Joseph is usually represented by a lily due to the legend mentioned above.

St. Joseph's Beard: This is actually just the Sheaf of Wheat turned upside down, but young children delight when their fathers and grandfathers hold their beard up to their face. It is another reminder of Joseph's wisdom.

Heart: A symbol of devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary that flourished throughout Italy in general and Sicily in particular in the 19th century.

The Crown of Thorns: This is in remembrance of Christ's passion and a reminder that, despite the day's feasting among Lent's fasting, Lent is still a season of sorrow — but of hope, too!

As this comes from a Sicilian custom, any Italian deserts can also be placed on the table.


