

PENTECOST SUNDAY May 19, 2024

INTROIT *Wisdom* 1:7

The Spirit of the Lord hath filled the whole world, alleluia; and that which contains all things hath knowledge of the voice, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm.* Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered: and let them that hate Him flee from before His face. \tilde{V} . Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.—The Spirit of the Lord . . .

O God, who on this day didst teach the hearts of Thy faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit: grant unto us, by the same Spirit, to be wise in what is right, and ever to rejoice in His consolation. Through our Lord . . .

EPISTLE Acts 2:1-11

When the days of the Pentecost were accomplished, they were all together in one place; and suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as it were of fire, and it sat upon every one of them; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they began to speak with divers tongues, according as the Holy Ghost gave them to speak. Now there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven. And when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded in mind, because that every man heard them speak in his own tongue. And they were all amazed, and wondered, saying: Behold, are not all these that speak Galileans? And how have we heard every one our own tongue wherein we were born? Parthians, and Medes, and Elamites, and inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia, and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the parts of Lybia about Cyrene, and strangers of Rome, Jews also, and Proselytes, Cretes, and Arabians: we have heard them speak in our own tongues the wonderful works of God.

ALLELUIA

Alleluia, alleluia. (*Psalm 103:30*) Send forth Thy Spirit, and they shall be created, and Thou shalt renew the face of the earth. Alleluia. (Here all genuflect.) Come, O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful: and kindle in them the fire of Thy love.

At that time Jesus said to His disciples: If any one love Me, he will keep My word, and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and will make Our abode in him: he that loveth Me not, keeps not My words. And the word which you have heard is not Mine; but the Father's who sent Me. These things have I spoken to you, abiding with you. But the Paraclete, the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in My Name, He will teach you all things, and bring all things to your mind, whatsoever I shall have said to you. Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, do I give unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, nor let it be afraid. You have heard that I said to you: I go away, and I come unto you. If you loved Me, you would indeed be glad, because I go to the Father: for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you before it come to pass: that when it shall come to pass you may believe. I will not now speak many things with you. For the prince of this world cometh, and in Me he hath not any thing. But that the world may know that I love the Father, and as the Father hath given Me commandment, so do I.-Creed.

FOOTSTEPS OF ST. PAUL WITH FR. ZACHARY AKERS, FSSP September 20 – October 1, 2024

Walk with the FSSP in the footsteps of Saint Paul, Saint John the Apostle, and the Blessed Mother as they travel to Greece and Turkey on this "New Testament Part II" pilgrimage, the standalone sequel to the Footsteps of Our Lord in the Holy Land. Climb the Areopagus. See the Parthenon, the Erechtheion, and learn about ancient Athens. Visit the famous Hanging Monasteries of Meteora, assist at Holy Mass in the Biblical cities of Corinth and Beroea, and see the Baptistery of Saint Lydia in Philippi. Visit Kavala, where Saint Paul arrived on his Second Missionary Journey. Go to Friday, July 19. For more information about Thessaloniki and venerate the Stone of Saint Paul there. Drive through the Vale of Tempe and the mountain pass of Thermopylae. Embark on a 3-day Iconic Aegean cruise: highlights include Mykonos, Santorini, Crete, the cave on Patmos, and Holy Mass in the House of Our Lady in Ephesus, Turkey, where tradition holds that Saint John took care of her in the latter part of her earthly life. Daily Masses will be sung with Gregorian chant.
