Christ the King October 29, 2023

Jesus is our King in the true sense of the word: He has created us, redeemed us, vivified us by His grace, He nourishes us with His Flesh and Blood, He governs us with love, and by love He draws us to Himself. In the face of such considerations, the cry of St. Paul rises spontaneously from our heart: "Giving thanks to God the Father . . . Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption, the remission of sins." Christ's Kingdom is not of this world. His Kingdom is so sublime that no dishonor, no insults can eclipse it. But, He prefers to manifest His Kingship far more as a conquest of His Blood than as a title belonging to Him in virtue of His divine nature. We should go to meet this divine King with all the yearning of our soul. He presents Himself to us under an appearance so human, so loving, so welcoming, stretching out His arms on the Cross to invite all to come to Him, showing us the wound in His side as the symbol of His Love. Far from trying to escape His dominion, we should beseech Him to be the sole Ruler of our mind and heart, and the complete Master of our will.

The Lamb that was slain is worthy to receive power and divinity and wisdom and strength and honor; to Him be glory and empire for ever and ever. Psalm. Brethren: Giving thanks to God the Father, who hath made us worthy to be partakers of the lot of the Saints in light: who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His Blood, the remission of sins; who is the image of the invisible God, the first born of every creature: for in Him were all things created in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible: whether thrones, or dominations, or principalities, or powers, all things were created by Him and in Him; and He is before all, and by Him all things consist, and He is the head of the body of the Church, who is the beginning, the first-born from the dead, that in all things He may hold the primacy because in Him it hath well-pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell; and through Him to reconcile all things unto Himself, making peace through the Blood of His cross, both as to the things on earth, and the things that are in heaven, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

On All Souls' Day, Thursday, November 2, three Masses will be offered in succession starting at 8:00 a.m. with a Sung Requiem Mass with absolution at the catafalque. The second Mass will begin around 9:00 a.m. and the third Mass will begin around 9:30. Please note, the time for the Low Masses is approximate.

First Friday & First Saturday

On First Friday, November 3, a Sung Mass will be offered at 8:00 a.m., and a Low Mass will be offered at 6:30 p.m. Exposition and Benediction will follow the evening Mass. On First Saturday, November 4, Low Masses will be offered at 7:00 and 9:00 a.m. with adoration from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. The blessing of sacramentals will take place after all four Masses. After Mass and Benediction, please kneel at the altar rail with the items that you want blessed.


